5.6 miles 15 mins

1. Turn Right on **RAINIER AVE S** - go **4.4** mi
2. Turn Right on **SEWARD PARK AVE S** - go **0.4** mi
3. Turn Right on **WABASH AVE S**
4. Bear Left on **55TH AVE S** - go **0.2** mi
5. Arrive at 8400 **55TH AVE S**, SEATTLE, on the Right

From Seattle: 10 miles 20 min

1. Take Left ramp onto **I-5 S** toward **PORTLAND/TACOMA** - go **7.0** mi
2. Take exit #158/**BOEING ACCESS RD/E MARGINAL WAY** - go **0.3** mi
3. Turn Left on **S BOEING ACCESS RD** - go **0.2** mi
4. Turn Left on **MARTIN LUTHER KING JR WAY S** - go **1.1** mi
5. Turn Right on **S HENDERSON ST** - go **0.4** mi
6. Turn Left on **RAINIER AVE S(WA-167)** - go **0.2** mi
7. Bear Right on **CLOVERDALE PL S** - go **0.2** mi
8. Bear Left on **S GRATTAN ST** - go **0.1** mi
9. Turn Right on **55TH AVE S**
10. Arrive at 8400 **55TH AVE S**, SEATTLE, on the Left
