BEEF:		No maximum number of entries per county. Juniors may exhibit one animal. Intermediates may exhibit three animals. Seniors may exhibit four animals.										
SWINE:		No maximum number of entries per county. Juniors may exhibit two animals. Intermediates and seniors may exhibit four animals.										
SHEEP/FLEECE GOATS:		No maximum number of entries per county. Juniors may exhibit two animals. Intermediates and seniors may exhibit four animals. Members may exhibit both sheep and fleece goats as they have been combined into one section.										
DAIRY GOATS:		No maximum number of entries per county. Juniors may exhibit two animals. Intermediates and seniors may exhibit four animals.										
DAIRY:		No maximum number of entries per County. Juniors may exhibit one animal. Intermediates may exhibit three animals. Seniors may exhibit four animals.										
NOVELTY GOATS:		No maximum number of entries per county. Juniors may exhibit two animals. Intermediates and seniors may exhibit four animals.
